There are several building projects that will be completed this summer. There are new roofs going on over the big gym, small gym, band, and choir areas. The restrooms on all three floors in the academic areas are being renovated with new fixtures, partitions, and lighting. This is a continued effort to keep our beautiful building upgraded and one of the finest facilities for its age.

There is a new twist with the iPad program this summer. Students may deduct either \$20 or 4 iPad hours if either paid in full or hours completed at registration (\$60 or 12 hours). If not, students will be required to pay the \$80 iPad partnership fee or complete 16 iPad partnership hours. SCHS accepts credit or debit cards for payment and the fees can be paid anytime this summer up through registration to get the reduced fee

Summer is a great time to earn the money to pay the fee or complete the partnership hours. Students will need to pay a minimum of \$20 or have completed 4 hours before the iPad will be issued in the fall. Students may pay \$20 or complete 4 hours each grading quarter until completion. I would like to take this opportunity to remind our parents/guardians about some of our guidelines at SCHS:

- 1. Cell phones must be turned off and in your student's locker during the school day. If a cell phone is turned in to the office, a parent/guardian must retrieve it before 3:45 PM.
- 2. Only students eligible for bus transportation may ride our school busses to and from school. If your student needs to ride a different bus before or after school, please send a note with your student or contact the main office.
- 3. Each student may be absent from school five times with parent/guardian contact. After those five days, they must submit a doctor's note for it to be excused.
- 4. When your student is absent, please make contact with our main office. Doctor's notes will be accepted up to 48 hours after the appointment.
